Thursday Session Descriptions

8:00 a.m.

First Time Stevne Orientation: If this is your first stevne, stop in for coffee, juice and a roll. Meet your fellow 'newbies' and get your questions about the stevne and bygdelag answered.

8:30 a.m.

Norwegian Soldiers in the Civil War: Norwegian Torbjørn Greipsland will discuss the experiences of the more than 6,000 Norwegian-American soldiers who participated in the American Civil War.

Family Search Page: Hidden Treasures: Genealogist Marilyn Sorenson will explore the Family Search website. Sections to be discussed are the Norway page, Norwegian databases in its collection of records, bygdebøk project in community trees, on-line classes and library catalog.

Nordmændene i Amerika: Originally published in Norwegian, publisher Deb Nelson Gourley will introduce you to the 3-volume translation that is now available, including sections devoted to Norwegian-American Civil War soldiers.

Hardanger Seminar: (Pre-registration required) Betty Knutson will help you learn the basics of Hardanger embroidery.

9:45 a.m.

Norwegian Emigration, the Civil War, and Andersonville: This overview session will be presented in Norwegian by Torbjørn Greipsland.

Traditional Norwegian Naming Conventions: Norwegian immigrants to America were introduced to a naming system that was very different from that used in Norway. New naming patterns were created, often with different surnames existing side by side in the same family. Genealogist Sharon Babcock will explain the traditional naming customs that can help inform your searches of genealogical records.

Rosemaling Styles: Vesterheim gold medal winner Patti Goke will highlight the history and differences among the various styles of Norwegian rosemaling.

11:00 a.m.

Action Beyond Duty: Six Norwegian soldiers received the Congressional medal of Honor for their heroic actions during the Civil War. Bob Hickcox, who is a descendant of a Union soldier and avid student of Civil War history, will tell the stories of these brave men.

Ideas for Writing Your Life Stories: Dr. Marilyn Stinson will focus on ideas for writing short stories, autobiographies, or biographies. Hopefully this session will motivate the audience members to go home and write!

Saturday Session Descriptions

8:00 a.m.

Andersonville and other POW Camps: Norwegian Torbjørn Greipsland will describe the grievous conditions faced by Norwegian-Americans imprisoned during the Civil War.

Digitalarkivet: The Norwegian Digital Archives: Researcher Dale Hovland will highlight online sources of Norwegian genealogical information, with a focus on the Digital Archives.

9:15 a.m.

Every Man Did His Duty: Stories about the Men of the First Minnesota Volunteer Infantry: Author Wayne Jorgenson will share the personal stories of the brave men of the regiment, from its commanders to its courageous young privates, some of whom were Norwegian by birth. He will discuss how the heritage and character of the men led them to be considered one of the finest regiments in the Union Army.

Researching Your Civil War Ancestors: How do you track down the truth about your family member's involvement in the Civil War? Dr. Linda Lee Larson will show you where to look and what you can find.

The Iringa Hope Story: Iringa Hope is a nonprofit working to develop micro-finance opportunities in Iringa, Tanzania. Dr. Thomas Hendrickson, a co-founder and current president of the project, will tell its inspiring story.

10:30 a.m.

The 15th Wisconsin (Scandinavian) Regiment: Drawing on historical research and Civil War letters, Gene Estensen will tell the story of this courageous unit, made up mostly of Norwegians.

Women, Gender, and Norwegian-American Communities: Historical Perspectives: Dr. Betty Bergland, author and professor at University of Wisconsin-River Falls, will explore women's contributions to Norwegian-American communities by focusing on their labor, material productions, and writing.

The Homestead Act: The Homestead Act became the engine of westward expansion after the war. Dr. John Kirn, Jr. will talk about the politics involved in its passage, effectiveness, and the consequences (both positive and negative) of this landmark legislation.

Norwegian Folk Tunes & Hymns: Settle into a seat in the Legends Bar for an hour of Norwegian Folk Music presented by "Den Norske Trio."

Norwegian Finger Weaving: (Pre-registration required) Jill Hanson and her daughters will teach you how to weave some of the ancient Norwegian *fletting* patterns.

11:00 a.m. (cont'd)

Norwegian Immigrants in Minnesota during the Civil War, Sioux Uprising and Grasshopper Plagues: Author Candace Simar will share her research and writings about the lives of Norwegian immigrants during the Civil War, 1862 Sioux Uprising, and the locust plagues of the 1870s.

12:45 p.m.

They came to America: The long journeys of the 19th Century immigrants from Norway into the Upper Midwest of America --- Routes, ships and travel conditions: Dr. Verlyn Anderson will discuss the various routes our ancestors traveled from Norway to America in the 1800s and what they experienced on the journeys.

Digitalarkivet: The Norwegian Digital Archives: Researcher Dale Hovland will highlight online sources of Norwegian genealogical information, with a focus on the Digital Archives.

Women, Gender, and Norwegian-American Communities: Historical Perspectives: Dr. Betty Bergland, author and professor at University of Wisconsin-River Falls, will explore women's contributions to Norwegian-American communities by focusing on their labor, material productions, and writing.

1:00 p.m.

Rosemaling: (Pre-registration required) Patti Goke will lead you through the process of making your own rosemaled wooden ornament.

2:00 p.m.

The 15th Wisconsin (Scandinavian) Regiment: Gene Estensen's two distant uncles volunteered and served with this brave unit, made up primarily of Norwegians. Drawing on historical research and Civil War letters, Gene will tell the story of this courageous unit's contributions, especially to the brutal battles fought in the Georgia Campaign.

The Homestead Act: The Homestead Act was passed at the height of the Civil War in 1862, and became the engine of westward expansion after the war. No group took greater advantage of it than did the Norwegians. Dr. John Kirn, Jr. will talk about the politics involved in its passage, its effectiveness, and the consequences (positive and negative) of this landmark legislation.

3:15 p.m.

Minnesota's Two Civil Wars: Minnesota was the first state to offer volunteer soldiers to the Union Cause. Stephen Osman, retired senior historian with the Minnesota Historical Society, will discuss both Minnesota's contributions to the Civil War and the impacts of the US Dakota War of 1862.

Beautiful Norway: Slides and Discussion Time: Jean Marthaler has led a number of tours of Norway for Brekke Travel, and shares some of her slides and experiences from the "Land of the Midnight Sun."

Friday Session Descriptions

1:30 p.m.

Norwegian Immigration and the US-Dakota War of 1862: Minnesota state representative (18B) and author Dean Urdahl will relate the causes and impact of the war relative to Norwegian immigrants and will give specific accounts of Norwegian participants, including the story of Guri Endreson.

Learning from Our Past: Insights from Norwegian Myths and Legends: Norse myths and sagas are our earliest and most reliable source for understanding the philosophy of our Viking ancestors. Dag Rossman has been a Viking storyteller since 1980 and has published 7 books on Norse mythology.

Life as a Husmann in Norway: Most of our emigrant ancestors were tenant farmers (husmenn) in Norway. Genealogist Sharon Babcock will describe the lives they lived and how their circumstances impacted their dreams of a new life in America.

Folkdancing with Furuleiken: Spend the afternoon with our Norwegian entertainers learning the basics of Norwegian folk dancing.

Julekurv (Norwegian Christmas Baskets: (Pre-registration required) Jan Heusinkveld will show you how to make these traditional Christmas ornaments. They're fun and easy to make!

2:45 p.m.

Norwegian-Americans in the Confederacy: Learn about immigrant settlements in South Carolina and Texas, the pro's and con's of southern settlement by Norwegians, and the attitudes and war experiences of Norwegians who fought for the South in the Civil War. Anne Sladky was introduced to the Texas settlements while researching ancestors who traveled to New Orleans with Bosque County TX-bound immigrants.

Researching Your Civil War Ancestors: How do you track down the truth about your family member's involvement in the Civil War? Dr. Linda Lee Larson will show you where to look and what you can find.

From Minnesota to Gudbrandsdal: Lessons (and pictures) from my life as an immigrant to Norway: North Dakota-born author and teacher Bev Stadum married and moved to Øyer, Norway in 2005. In this session she'll share the usual, unusual, and discuss the changes in Norwegian society by contrasting the lives of her mother-in-law, husband and nephew.

Honoring Our Civil War Soldiers

Take a few minutes in the genealogy room to look at each lag's banner honoring the Civil War and U.S.-Dakota War soldiers and militiamen with roots in its home community. Members also submitted the names of their Norwegian ancestor-soldiers from outside the 7-Lag home areas. If your Norwegian soldier isn't listed, we'll be happy to add him to our banners. The banners will remain on display through the Saturday evening banquet.
